The goal of the Association is to reunite all direct or by marriage survivors of the Audet dit Lapointe descendants that have colonized New France and the Americas, publish our ancestry, create Audet dit Lapointe archives and establish a library of various publications concerning the history of the Audet dit Lapointe families and to distribute this information by newsletters or other means

The principal activities of the association are the regular distribution of newsletters called « Nicolas et Magdeleine », organizing family gatherings, regional and international family reunions and maybe, organize a trip to our ancestor Audet dit Lapointe's country,

## A bit of history

Nicolas Audet was baptized on July 12<sup>th</sup>, 1637 in the parish church of St-Pierre in Maulais, France. Today, this parish is part of the village of Taizé, in the county of Thouars in the department of Deux-Sèvres. The son of Innocent Audet and Vincende Roy, he arrived in Canada around 1663 at the age of 26. Monsignor Laval confirmed him on March 23<sup>rd</sup>, 1664. In the 1666 census, he is working on Monsignor Laval's farm in St-Joachim, Cap Tourmente. He is already using the surname Lapointe.

On June 22<sup>nd</sup>, 1667, Monsignor Laval, Lord of Beaupré and Île d'Orléans, grants him a concession of land, consisting of three acres (arpents) of frontage along the Saint Lawrence River on the south side of the island. Notwithstanding his obligation to get established on his land within the year, on October 13<sup>th</sup>, 1668, he is working as a porter at Monsignor Laval's Episcopal residence in Québec.

Magdeleine Després was born about 1655. Her parents, François and Magdeleine Le Grand, are from the parish of Saint-Sauveur de Paris. She is one of the so-called, Filles du Roi ( Daughters of the King), recruited in France in 1669-1670, in compliance with intendant Talon's wishes. It is therefore, during the afternoon of August 30<sup>th</sup>, 1670, in the presence of Anne Gasnier and Élisabeth Estienne, who sign as witnesses, that Magdeleine who is 15 years old, accepts and promises to marry Nicolas by signing a marriage contract before notary, Romain Becquet. Father Thomas Morel celebrated their marriage on September 15<sup>th</sup>, 1670 in the parish church of Ste-Famille, lie d'Orléans.

In the 1681 census, they owned about 15 acres of land ready for cultivation, six horned

animals and a gun. An inventory taken September 27<sup>th</sup>, 1706 by notary, Étienne Jacob, describes their total worth as being that of; seventy five acres of land, a house 24 feet long by 18 feet wide finished in rough beams, including two full length rooms, two fireplaces, a cellar an attic, and a barn and stable finished in planks measuring 60' X 20' from one end to the other..

Nicolas was buried December 10<sup>th</sup>, 1700 in the St-Jean cemetery in Île d'Orléans. Magdeleine survived him by 12 years. Their farm carries the lot numbers 192 and 193 on the actual cadastral map of the parish of St-Jean, Île d'Orléans.

## « Their children »

Listed below are the children of our ancestors as published by Guy Saint-Hilaire in his 1986 publication called "Les Lapointe des Bergeronnes". Nicolas' farm was in the parish of St-Famille, Île d'Orléans until 1680, date at which the parish of St-Jean was created.

1. **Nicolas**, born in 1671, died shortly after his birth.
2. **Nicolas**, born in 1672, married Marie -Louise Chabot, already a widow at 15 years old, in 1697 in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans. They have nine children. They are the ancestors of well known persons such as, Renaude Lapointe and Ernest Lapointe. Nicolas died in 1751 in St-François-du-Sud (Montmagny). Marie-Louise died in 1756.
3. **Pierre**, born in 1674, married Marie Dumas in 1698 in St-Jean, Île d'Orléans.
4. **Jean-Baptiste**, born in 1675, married Marie-Louise Godbout in 1708 in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans. In 1698, his father donates him land located in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans. The family estate is then perpetuated from father to son. In 1979, while celebrating four parish tricentennials and family reunions on the island, some of their descendants got together to install a commemorative plaque in the local church.
5. **Madeleine**, born in 1677, married Jean Pouliot in 1697 in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans.
6. **Joseph** is the son who was baptized October 27<sup>th</sup>, 1680 and who's name has disappeared from the registers. Certain genealogists have deducted that he was a third Nicolas, others say he was Joachim. They think that the second Nicolas died very young and Joseph would have been born in 1679, or in 1681. The Joseph born in 1680 was the one retained by Guy Saint-Hilaire, who himself is a descendant on his mothers side. Joseph inherited the family estate and married Jeanne Pouliot in 1703 in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans. They are the ancestors of a long line of Lapointe located mainly in the Saguenay and Lac St-Jean area.
7. **Marie**, born in 1682, married Maurice Crépeau in 1702 in St-Jean, Île d'Orléans.
8. **François**, born in 1684, married Marguerite Bernard in 1709 in St -Laurent, Île d'Orléans. A large part of their lineage is located in the Eastern Townships. The name is shared between Audet and Lapointe.
9. **Marguerite**, born in 1686, married Louis Emery (Coderre) in 1722 in Boucherville, where she followed the family of her brother Joachim. She lived the rest of her life in L'Assomption.
10. **Innocent**, born in 1689, married Geneviève Lemelin in 1710 in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans.
11. **Joachim**, born about 1691, married Louise-Hyacinthe Roberge in 1716 in St-Laurent, Île d'Orléans. They left to settle in Boucherville.

On September 13<sup>th</sup> 2003 we commemorated the 333<sup>rd</sup> wedding anniversary of Nicolas and Magdeleine in Ste-Famille, Île D'Orléans, where they were married.

The second annual assembly took place in the Charlevoix region, more precisely in Cap-à-L' Aigle near La Malbaie. This was on September 13<sup>th</sup> 2004.

The 2005 annual meeting and general assembly took place on September 10<sup>th</sup> in the beautiful region of Lac St-Jean, at St-Gedeon on the shore of the lake.

For 2006, the meeting held in Sherbrooke on September 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> was the occasion for Nicolas and Magdeleine to unveil the official Coats of Arms of the association.

The 2007 annual meeting held on Sept. 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup> at Lac-Etchemin in the Chaudières - Appalaches region was the biggest event with over 400 participants.
